

I-PASS: A system for patient handoffs

- Starmer AJ et al. Pediatrics 2012; 129: 201-4.
- I-PASS, a Mnemonic to Standardize Verbal Handoffs
 - I: Illness Severity
 - P: Patient Summary
 - A: Action List
 - S: Situation Awareness and Contingency Planning
 - S: Synthesis by Receiver

I-PASS: A system for patient handoffs

- I-PASS--a validated system of patient handoffs
- Goal--*shared "mental model"* of the patient in current context
- I-PASS is incorporated into ORCHID, the new EHR for LA County, and will be an on-line tool for patient handoffs.

I-PASS: A system for patient handoffs

I: Illness Severity

- Stable, Watcher, Unstable, or Discharge?
- Uses standard language
- "Watcher" means you may have a potential problem.
- Update daily

I-PASS: A system for patient handoffs

P: Patient Summary

a. Summary Statement: “A one-liner” that sets the *clinical context*

- Name
- Age
- Gender
- Pertinent past history
- Reason for admission

I-PASS: A system for patient handoffs

P: Patient Summary

b. Events Leading Up to Admission

- Bulleted list of *essential* information
- Relevant history/examination/labs

c. Hospital Course

- Relevant key events
- Family/Social
- Current nursing concerns

I-PASS: A system for patient handoffs

P: Patient Summary

d. Assessment

- Diagnosis or differential diagnosis
- Problem List *or* System List
- Current level of (un)certainty

e. Plan

- Global
- Specific plan for each problem
